Cast (say: kast) - If you ever break a bone, you will probably need a cast to hold the pieces of bone steady while they're healing. Casts wrap around the broken area and be made out of plaster, fiberglass, or even plastic and air. A cast lets your broken bone grow back together again.

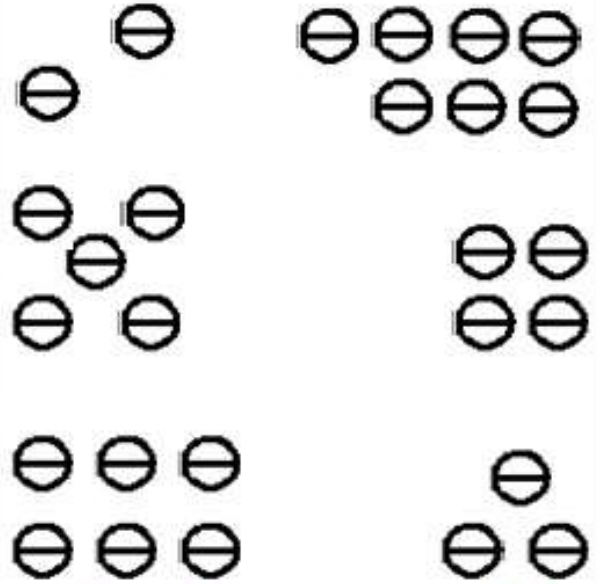

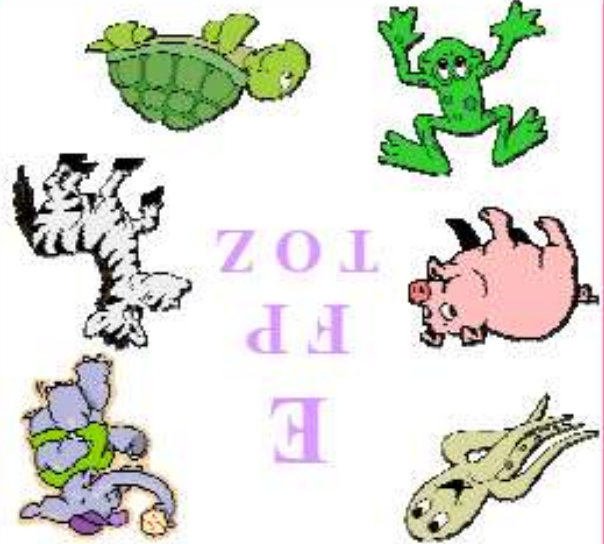

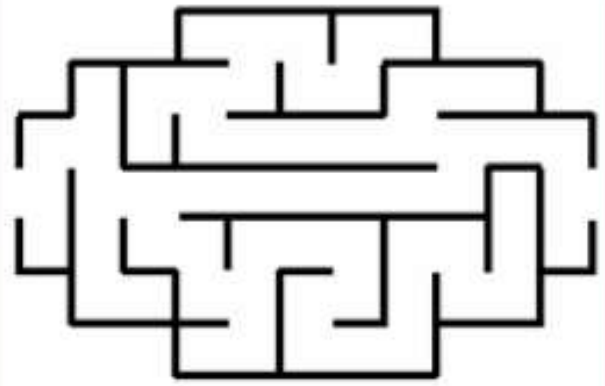
